PLEASE DO NOT LIGHT FIRES OR BARBEQUES. DO NOT LEAVE CHILDREN OR VALUABLES UNATTENDED.

- BMIHT reserves the right to refuse admission should visitors breach any Rules and Regulations of the BMIHT.
- Display vehicles should be in position by 9.30am (gates open 7.30am) and should not normally leave before the show finishes.
- Vehicle passes are for display vehicles, If you are bringing your display vehicle on a trailer once the display vehicle has been unloaded the event support vehicle and trailer must leave the arena and park at the top of the site (behind the control building). Please note that vehicles with a disabled badge are also not allowed on the arena (unless they are a display vehicle), they should be parked in the appropriate disabled parking area.
- Un-restored vehicles may be permitted (at the organisers discretion) by prior acceptance. Such vehicles will be trailered to the show and must have the appropriate insurance.
- All vehicles driven to the show must have Road Tax, MOT (where applicable) and at least Third Party Insurance.
- Only vehicles displaying a Vehicle pass will be allowed into the display areas. All other vehicles will be directed to the public parking areas.
- Display locations and movement of display vehicles are under the control of the show organisers.
- Clubs will select vehicles to parade in the show ring at specified times (numbers may be restricted to meet time schedules).
- The British Motor Museum and grounds are open to the public from 10am—5pm.
- Attendance at the show and camping/caravanning or parking is at your own risk.
- Toilets and showers will be available on site for campers but there will not be any electric hook-ups.
- With exception of assistance dogs, we regret that pets are not permitted anywhere in the museum. Pets must be kept on a lead at all times.
- All tickets are non-refundable.

Camping:

The camping pass issued by the British Motor Museum must be shown on entry to the site by each caravan/camping unit and displayed at all times. On arrival, it is the responsibility of the camper to report to the Campsite Officer to agree pitching instructions. Do not arrive before the campsite opens at 4pm on Friday 2 May, as the marshal will not be available for check-in. Gates will be closed each night at 9pm until 7.30am the next day.

The Pitch:

Caravans and tents must be pitched at a minimum of 6 metres apart and in a position agreed with the Campsite Officer, leaving access to the water supplies for fire fighting.

No holes, pits or drainage channels should be dug on the site without the express consent of the Campsite Officer.

Pitches must be kept tidy and left clean on vacating the site. Sanitation:

The contents of chemical toilets must be disposed of at the disposal point provided.

Wastewater must be collected in a suitable receptacle and disposed of at the disposal point provided.

Rubbish:

All rubbish must be deposited in the bin bags provided and the bags left at the refuse disposal point provided.

Clubs using the campsite for a Rally must provide their own bin bags. A charge will be made to the club for litter picking, if the site is left dirty.

Vehicles:

Vehicles must not be driven unnecessarily on the campsite and all drivers must hold a current driving licence. Learner and unlicensed drivers are not permitted to drive on the site. A speed limit of 5 M.P.H. is applicable to ALL vehicles on the campsite.

Mechanically powered, passenger carrying model, toy or miniature vehicles are not permitted to be driven on the campsite.

Motorised scooters, skateboards and mopeds are not permitted to be driven on the campsite.
