Pets must be kept on a lead at responsibility or liability for theft,	Camping: The camping pass issued by the British Motor Museum must be shown on entry to the site by each caravan/camping unit and displayed at all times. On arrival, it is the responsibility of the camper to report to the Campsite Officer to agree pitching instructions. Do not arrive before the campsite opens at 4pm on Saturday 19 July, as the marshal will not be available for check-in. Gates will be closed each night at 9pm until 7.30am the next day. The Pitch: Caravans and tents must be pitched at a minimum of 6 metres apart and in a position agreed with the Campsite Officer, leaving access to the water supplies for fire fighting. No holes, pits or drainage channels should be dug on the site without the express consent of the Campsite Officer. Pitches must be kept tidy and left clean on vacating the site. Sanitation: The contents of chemical toilets must be disposed of at the disposal point provided. Wastewater must be collected in a suitable receptacle and disposed of at the disposal point provided. Rubbish: All rubbish must be deposited in the bin bags provided and the bags left at the refuse disposal point provided. Clubs using the campsite for a Rally must provide their own bin bags. A charge will be made to the club for litter picking, if the site is left dirty. Vehicles: Vehicles: Vehicles must not be driven unnecessarily on the campsite and all drivers must hold a current driving licence. Learner and unlicensed drivers are not permitted to drive on the site. A speed limit of 5 M.P.H. is applicable to ALL vehicles on the campsite. Mechanically powered, passenger carrying model, toy or miniature vehicles are not permitted to be driven on the campsite. Motorised scooters, skateboards and mopeds are not permitted to be driven on the campsite.
